Some of the original field boundaries (relating to enclosures that were probably set out in the post medieval period) have been retained, which ensures the previous character here remains legible in the present day.

Ridge and furrow shows in the central part of this area on the 2001 and 2005/06 aerial photographs. This may indicate that the piecemeal enclosures consolidated earlier strip fields which would have formed part of an open field system. These strips may have had Saxon/medieval origins.

Bezzles Farm exists in the northern part of this area and is shown on the 1 ed 6" OS map. However, it is too small to map as a separate character area so has been included here.
